Data for Sport Specific Development. Russell Turner (Sport England) Dale Burton (Derbyshire Sport) & Ross Baxter (RFU)

NGBs will be aware of the data that is available to support their work. This session is designed to give a better understanding of the variety of data being held and how this might benefit sports specific interventions. Examples will be given of information that has been requested by some Governing Bodies and Local Authorities and how this has been used. Discussion will identify the opportunities available to sports to apply data to their planning and consider if the Regional NGB Forum has a role to play here.

Update on National Developments. Wendy Campbell (Sport England)

This short session will attempt to inform delegates on the principles behind the changes to national strategy proposed from April 08. It will give an update on negotiations with the CSPs, discuss the status of national NGB plans and consider how these things may shape future delivery in the East Midlands. The session will also aim to find out what messages are available internally within NGBs. (It would help if NGB Officers could be clear on what information is currently available from their national offices.)

Removing barriers to participation in sport – Engaging with hard to access groups. Martin Glynn

Following on from the morning session about using demographic data, a linked session is planned for the afternoon. This is aimed at inclusion and promises to be thought provoking. It will challenge people to think about the way sport specific activity is presented to, and attempts to engage with, community groups. Martin Glynn is an activist, poet, author and trainer who is a well renowned Criminologist by trade (and who was closely involved in the recent Channel 4 series “Banged Up”). Additionally Martin has been employed by The Sports Council’s Equity Officers Group and Sport England to assist with issues such as community development, community cohesion, widening access and increasing participation.
